

To Students Newly Arriving in Japan (New Students) and Students Currently in Their Home Country (Current International Students)

Due to the spread of the novel coronavirus infectious disease, there are cases where travel to Japan and departures from the students' home country are restricted, and even if entry into Japan is possible, to strengthen its quarantine measures, a 14-day quarantine period at a designated location (such as a hotel) may be required. In addition, there is a request from the government to not use public transportation within Japan during the quarantine period.

Therefore, until you are able to secure your safety in travelling to Japan and a method for transportation to your quarantine location in Japan, we strongly recommend against travelling to Japan.

Here, we will inform you about measures related to entry into Japan and responses.

- Information about regions where permission to land in Japan is denied, and countries and regions with visa restrictions

*Information about countries and regions where foreigners with a history of stay in the last 14 days will be denied permission to land in Japan, or where the validity of visas of those newly travelling to Japan will be lost.
- Even if your country is not on the list of those denied landing/the issue is resolved and entry into Japan becomes possible, isolation/quarantine may be required by the Quarantine Act, and a 14-day quarantine period at a location (i.e. your house, including dormitories and apartments) specified by the quarantine station chief may be required. In addition, public transportation (buses, trains, taxis, etc.) may not be used to go to your house, etc. Therefore, cars or rental vehicles must be prepared on an individual basis.
- As entry into Japan and domestic travel after entry will both be difficult, Nagoya University is planning special accommodations such as delaying the start of the semester and allowing class participation from outside the university by use of the Internet.

Therefore, **before taking action to enter Japan from countries and regions with**

entry restrictions, we strongly recommend that you contact your school/graduate school, and please only travel to Japan after securing your safety.
